What has Healing a Woman's Soul been up to?

• **A New Day:** Offering a grant of approximately \$500 for furniture and home essentials to women moving into a new home. This project is offered in partnership with the Columbia County Habitat for Humanity ReStore in Hudson, NY.

- Education: Healing a Woman's Soul meets with secular and nonprofit organizations to host booths at public events to educate the public about Domestic Violence and offer resources for those seeking help.

Distributing to shelters: Our donors have given extravagantly during this past year. Our board members have gathered and delivered more than 45 car-loads of personal care items, clothes, cleaning products, luggage, gift bags, food and household items.

At any given time, there are more than 100 women and children in domestic violence shelters in the immediate vicinity. The shelters tell us that over half of their women are pregnant or have children (or both). Gifts for children are gifts for their mothers, who worry about what they are not able to provide once they leave their homes. Like God the Father, they desire to give good gifts to their children, and through your generosity we have been able to assist them in doing that.
